

#### Coffee Prevents Cirrhosis

a cup o' joe each morning may prevent the onset of liver disease. A scarred liver is a damaged liver; over time, those scars become stiffer and lose function. Cirrhosis occurs slowly, over a long period of time, and can be measured by how "stiff" these scars become. The more scar tissue your liver contains, the more likely you are to head toward liver failure. Infections like hepatitis, chronic alcohol ingestion, and even chronic use of medications can all lead to cirrhosis in the liver.

Researchers studied diets (specifically how much tea and coffee people drank) and then measured how stiff each patient's liver tissue was before and after regular ingestion. They found that people who drink three or more cups of coffee every day have significantly lower stiffness in their liver, and thus, achieve better liver function.

Anything that releases dopamine into your system significantly boosts your mood. That's why it's called the "feel good chemical." And when it comes to dopamine-boosting drinks, few do it as safely and reliably as your favorite brew.

Coffee has an almost immediate effect on feel-good chemicals in the brain, so for most people, it can and will help you prevent or fight off mild cases of the blues. Just be careful not to exceed more than a few cups a day or you could find yourself anxious from the caffeine.

If they give it out freely, that's a red flag.

Check for bedbugs

bed bugs
Even the best hotels can end up with bedbugs, especially with growing pesticide resistance. Avoid those itchy bumps by examining for the bugs be-fore you unpack. Quickly pull away the comforter, and watch for brown bugs that are about the size of an apple seed scampering away. Take a close look at the pillows, mattress liners, and mattress seams for bugs or bloodstains. If you see anything questionable, ask for another room, and do another search

Stranger danger! When you hear a knock, look through the peephole or ask who's there before opening your door. If you didn't order room service or the drop-in seems like an odd time, double check that the hotel sent someone by calling the front desk

Double check for bedbugs at home

Someone is packing clothes in baggage. It does help to reduce wrinkling.
When you get back from your trip, head to the laundry room to check your luggage for signs of bedbugs. If you see any signs, toss the clothes straight into the wash, and follow up in the dryer on high heat for at least 15 minutes. Items

that can't be washed can be put in the freezer for a couple of days. Those nasty bugs won't be able to survive the extreme temperatures.

Pack your own sheets Hotel sheets could be crawling with dust mites, allergens, and germs. Throw your own sheet over the bed-spread so you're not exposed to those

Wear long sleeves

Another easy way to avoid contact with the bedding is to pack pajamas with long sleeves and long pants. A pair of light socks will help even more.

Use your bed only to sleep

If you're watching TV or working on your laptop, shift over to the desk or chair in your hotel room. It's more hygienic, plus you'll probably have an easier time falling asleep once bedtime

Put up the "do not disturb" sign A sign with "please make up room" is basically an announcement to thieves that you're not there. Hang the "do not disturb" one instead to fake it that you're still around. Call housekeeping to let them know they should still make up your room while you're out.

Use the main entrance

Instead of using side doors when you return to your room at night, go through the main lobby. You might be farther from your room, but you'll have the extra security of employees' eyes on you and anyone who follows

Don't forget the fitness facilities

If you're staying longer than a few days, make sure your lodging has a workout room or pool. Now promise yourself you'll take advantage so you can reduce the stiffness you get when traveling. Plus, you can indulge at the breakfast buffet or with wedding cake without stressing about added pounds.

Light a candle A fragrant candle will smell much more pleasing than that stale hotel room scent, giving you some stressbusting aromatherapy. Just blow it out before you leave the room or fall asleep so you don't risk causing a fire.

Use a makeshift humidifier The air in hotel rooms can be notoriously dry. If your room has a kitchen area, fill the teakettle with water and heat it on the stove. Let the steam escape into the room until the water has almost all evaporated. Read about more hacks to stay healthy in your ho-

Bring a pair of flip-flops

There have been docusing the midget submarine assisted by Ensign Tanner. mentaries, interviews, and recognitions for then Ensign Tanner due to his involvement preceding the attack including a segment on *Lt. Col Oliver*North's "War Stories."

Following the Pearl Harbor inci-

dent and attack Ensign Tanner was transferred to the European Theater of operations. Flying his PBY on Recon Missions from England over the English Channel and Bay of Biscay, off France.

Shot down by several German fighters during one of these patrols; he was wounded by a machine gun bullet through his side. Only three crew members survived the attack, crash landing into the sea and remaining in

a life raft for three days.

They kept their damaged raft floating by blowing air through leaking bullet holes repeatedly for three days even though they were all wounded. It was all a miracle, when they were spotted and rescued by a British destroyer. Why a miracle? Because they had no radio equipment, and no one know where they were One of the one knew where they were. One of the men later died in a hospital; the other two returned to the war effort. Ensign Tanner received the Purple Heart and Distinguished Flying Cross for his

Ensign Tanner was promoted to Captain, continued his career in the Navy and was later commanding Officer at the Olathe Naval Air Station. Following that, he was Commanding Officer at NAS Los Alamitos, California before he retired.

There were many area servicemen during WWII with outstanding service in all areas of the armed forces sadly they are nearly all gone. Several were my good friends, some acquaintances. I am so very proud to have known them all.

James B. Loftus, I don't remember exactly but Jim flew around 30 missions over the enemy. Jim came home to the good life, didn't talk about his achievements unless asked. Most of us didn't know his/their war record unless we asked.

William "Bill" Allen, a Johnson County Judge and friend, Bill was a survivor of the Bataan Death March, a purple heart recipient was near death as were most survivors at the time of their rescue.

Harold "Tuffy" Walters, a P 51 pilot, it seems like Walters was an ace but I'm not sure about that. When he came home, he was a jeweler at the old Norris Drug store where a lot of us high school kids hung out, a friendly guy, we were proud to know him and his background. Even at our young age we were aware of his heroics, WWII was still a vivid memory for those of us that paid attention.

Harley Haskin was a company intelligence officer who served in Europe during World War II with the 94th Infantry Division where he served 14 months in the G-2 section.

William "Bill" Mace, US Navy,

spent 2 years aboard ship, came home, married his sweetheart and after graduating from KU taught and coached football and basketball at Olathe North High School.

Carold Bland, WWII, from 1939-1945, Carold was in the 12th Armored "Hell Cat" Division. That's "Old Blood and Guts," General Patton's Army.

David House, 24th Division, 21st Infantry was a demolitions expert. Dave received the Bronze Star, Philippine Liberation medal, the Asiatic Pacific medal, the Good Conduct medal, the Victory medal, and the Army Occupational medal. Those of us that knew David knew he was a veteran, but I did not know of his decorations.

Edward "Ed" Redinger was in the



Marshal designed and built the first electronic score board for Olathe High schools. See all at the Ensor Park and Museum, 18995 W 183rd, Olathe, sea-


